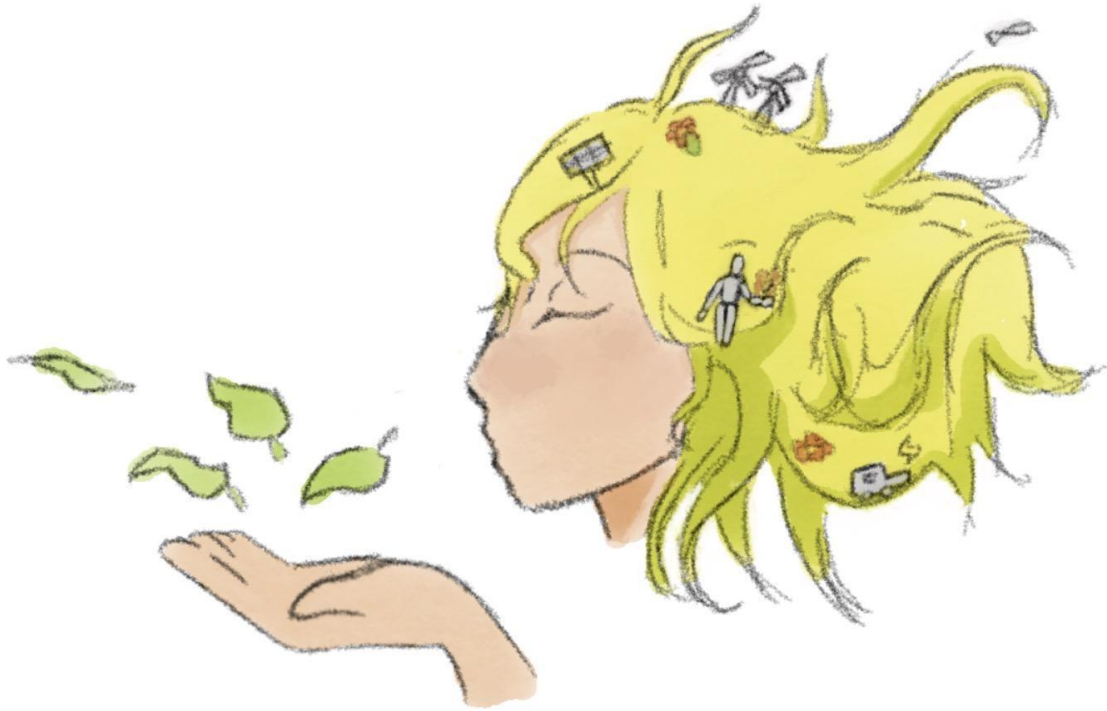


The Future I Want to Help Build
